


# How to Add Lap Child on American Airlines?

# Introduction

# What Is the American Airlines Lap Child Policy?

The [american airlines lap child policy](#) allows infants under a certain age to travel on an adult's lap without occupying a separate seat. This policy applies to domestic and many international flights, though rules vary slightly by region. Airlines encourage early communication about lap infants so paperwork and seating arrangements can be prepared before arrival at the airport.

## Key features:

- Infant onboard on lap
- Not occupying a seat
- Applies on many routes



# Age Requirements for Lap Children

Under the American Airlines lap child policy, infants typically must be under 2 years old on the day of travel to qualify as a lap child. Once they reach age 2, a paid seat is required. Some international routes have specific requirements or documentation checks, so parents should verify before booking.

Age rules include:

- Under 2 years = lap child
- 2+ years = paid seat
- Route-specific checks

# How to Add a Lap Child During Booking

When booking a flight on the American Airlines website or app, the american airlines lap child policy allows you to add an infant as a lap child in the passenger details section. Input the child's name and date of birth. This ensures the system recognizes the lap child and doesn't charge a seat for them.

## Steps include:

- Enter passenger info
- Add infant DOB
- Confirm lap child status



# Adding a Lap Child After Booking

If you forgot to add a lap child during booking, the american airlines lap child policy still allows updates later. You can modify the reservation online or call customer support. It's best to add a lap child as soon as possible to avoid issues at check-in.

## Post-booking options:

- Manage reservation
- Call support
- Update passenger list



# Fees Associated with Lap Children

American Airlines typically does not charge a separate fare for lap children under the American Airlines lap child policy on domestic flights. However, government taxes or international carrier charges may still apply. Some international routes impose a small charge even for lap kids.

## Fee types may include:

- Govt tax only
- Intl service charges
- Fare exceptions



# Documentation Required

To comply with the american airlines lap child policy, parents should carry proof of age for the infant. A birth certificate or passport is often required for international travel, while domestic flights may also ask for ID.

## Required docs include:

- Birth certificate
- Passport (if needed)
- Infant ID



# Common Questions Parents Ask

Parents often ask whether the lap child counts toward passenger limits, how carry-on allowance changes, or what happens if connecting. The american airlines lap child policy clarifies that lap infants usually travel with the adult's baggage allowances and clearest guidelines are available online.
