

How to Check Alaska Airlines Baggage Size Limits?

Why Baggage Size Limits Matter?

Alaska Airlines keeps no secrets about its policies; however, this does not imply that its baggage rules are tolerant. It is essential to have a good understanding of Alaska Airlines' baggage dimension policy, whether you are carrying a small bag or checking in a bigger suitcase. Knowing the baggage limit will help you pack properly and not pay for extra luggage.

Even a minor difference in weight or size can lead to trouble at the airport. The airline allows each of its passengers to carry the following as carry-on bags:

- one carry-on bag,
- one personal item (that can be a purse, laptop bag, or small backpack),

And [Alaska Airlines baggage](#) has the maximum size for carry-on that is allowed:

- 22 x 14 x 9 inches (this includes wheels and handles)
- The personal item must be entirely under the seat in front of you. In case of carry-on is larger than the indicated size, it could be **checked** in at the gate, and if your fare type is this which incurs in case of these situations, you will have to pay the extra fee.

As for the checked bags, Alaska Airlines does not complicate things much. According to the **Alaska Airlines baggage policy 2025**, the main checked bags have to be within the general limits given below:

- Maximum size: 62 linear inches (length + width + height)
- Maximum weight: 50 pounds per bag
- Bags over **100 pounds** won't be accepted at all

This is where a luggage scale at home quietly becomes your best travel companion.

Alaska Airlines Baggage Allowance Depends on Your Ticket:

Not all tickets are created equal, and your fare type plays a role.

- **Saver fares:** Carry-on and personal item only
- **Main Cabin fares:** Checked bags allowed for a fee
- **First Class:** More baggage freedom
- **Elite members & certain cardholders:** Often get free checked bags

Always double-check what your ticket includes before heading out.

How to Measure Your Bag Without Overthinking It?

To check **Alaska Airlines baggage size** at home:

- Place the bag flat on the floor
- Measure height, width, and depth
- Include wheels and handles (they count)
- Add the numbers together

If it's under 62 inches total, you're good.

Special Items and Exceptions

Some things don't follow regular [Alaska Airlines baggage rules](#):

- Sports gear may count as a checked bag
- Musical instruments must meet size limits or need a seat
- Mobility aids are generally accepted without extra fees
- Valuable or fragile items belong in your carry-on
